Principal's Message

December is around the corner and this is certainly a very busy time of year at AES. Students and staff having been working hard to build and contribute to our learning community. We have had the opportunity to host Laureen Felix from Splatsin to teach classes the Secwepemc Welcome Song. We are working hard school-wide on developing student belonging (self-regulation for social awareness and responsibility) and student wellness (self- regulation for personal awareness and responsibility). We are focusing on appropriate play at school; play that promotes respect, responsibility and safety in order to build a safe, caring and orderly environment that prioritizes learning. Everyone has the responsibility to contribute positively to a learning environment that is welcoming and builds a sense of belonging for all students. Keeping hands and feet to self, our bodies in our own space, especially when frustrated, is an expectation for all students. In celebration of the learning we do, at the end of most months (for November, our assembly will be held December 5th), we watch a slide show of pictures from different events and learning opportunities of the past month. 
Our school goals:

Writing: As previously mentioned, student writing can be supported by helping students to build their oral language skills. If there's an opportunity to look at photos during the holiday season, invite your child to tell you all about the photo: who is in the photo, what do you see, what facts do you know from observing the photo, and what kinds of inferences can we make

from the photo (ex: Grandma looks happy in the photo and I think it's because she's in the garden and she likes to spend time there). Invite your child to consider questions about the photo (ex: I wonder what she's going to do with all those zucchini she's picked?).

We are excited to continue with the tradition of a Family Letter Writing afternoon, this year being held on November 28 (1-2pm). Students will be invited to write a letter to Santa or to other family members and friends. For students who aren't able to have an adult join them, teachers, CEAs and other parents can support alongside students, helping them write as well.

Numeracy: Winter holidays are great times to play games with your families. For our youngest learners, board games that require players to roll dice and count ahead squares are great learning opportunities. For older students, games that involve practicing facts are very beneficial. "Yahtzee" is a great game to practice math skills. All that is required to play Yahtzee are 5 regular dice and a game board such as the one shown below:



Skating

Our skating sessions are a real hit with staff and students alike. Skating is one of those skills that can provide life-long enjoyment and we are really fortunate to have a partnership with the City of Armstrong that allows us to use the arena so often. One reminder for those heading skating... Students must wear a helmet \mathfrak{S} and we strongly recommend adult helpers to also wear one when on the ice. It's important to look after our health and safety and we sure appreciate the modeling from adults that being safe is important for everyone!

Written Learning Updates (aka Report cards)

Your child's first formal learning update will be sent home on December 16. There will be specific comments in the areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Social-Emotional learning. These three areas are the primary focus for the first term of the year. All other curricular areas will receive a proficiency level indicator but are not required to have individual comments. Really, the focus of elementary is to develop the foundational skills of literacy and numeracy which is why you will hopefully notice such an emphasis on these areas in your child's classroom work as well as being reflected on the learning update.

Holiday Hampers

Once again at this time of year, our school would like to put together 3-4 hampers for families in our community who could use a little extra support this holiday season. A separate informational notice describing the holiday hamper drive, with suggestions for each classroom's giving, is coming home with your child. Please note that this is completely optional. Please participate to the extent that you can, and do not feel pressure to give. We realize that times are tough for many and we all need support in different ways at different times. We support each other however we are able.

What we learned on the last pro D day:

Teachers were hard at work at AES on the last Pro D day on November 10. We focused on student well-being with an emphasis on the Physical and Health Education curriculum. Facilitated by Amy Witt (Specialized Sexual Health Educator), we discussed resources to support learning around boundaries and consent. A few teachers focused on Numeracy, Reconciliation/ Indigenous education with afternoon sessions on Art, Coding.

Inside Restoration and Painting

Plans have been in the works for at least a few years now to restore and repaint the inside of AES. This is an enormous undertaking given the size and heritage of AES... and the long-awaited work is finally about to begin. Our school district crew is working with safety consultant Apex EHS Services to help ensure the project runs safely and smoothly. Painting will begin in Mr. Weeks' classroom and we will have a better idea in the coming weeks how long it will take each classroom to be done. Getting ready for such a project is no small task, so we truly appreciate all the support staff and students are putting into this. While a classroom is being worked on, that class will be relocated to the music room. Mrs. Normandeau's Monday, Thursday and Friday music classes will be held in the library. Ms. Julie's Tuesday and Wednesday music classes may be held in the gym. We anticipate at this time that Mrs. Quinton's and then Mr. Belec's classrooms will be next on the list for restoration/painting.
